

What is the Yardleys Personal Development Curriculum?

The Personal Development Curriculum is designed to ensure we educate the ‘whole child’ here at Yardleys School. The curriculum is devised to develop an understanding of the ever-changing world in which we live, develop the skills necessary to take an active role in their community and manage their life effectively in the future.

The Personal Development Curriculum at is implemented throughout Yardleys School via:

- Weekly themed assemblies
- Weekly Personal Development sessions delivered by form tutors
- Personal Development sessions delivered by external agencies (including the West Midlands Police and Loudmouth Theatre)
- Weekly Enrichment sessions
- Participation in school clubs
- Undertaking student leadership roles.

What is the Yardleys Personal Development Curriculum?

Yardleys Personal Development curriculum has been structured using a thematic spiral approach with age appropriate content throughout. The content was selected using the statutory guidance as a guide to key topics, with student and teacher input on the ordering and addition of extra content.
