



Parental Information

Yardleys Learner

Based on the best academic research available, we have devised a clear set of expectations for students in our lessons in order to maximise their academic progress. This is called the Yardleys Learner. The focus is on ensuring your child is **engaged** in their learning, and embracing opportunities to have **to think**, **discuss and collaborate**. We know if they do, their academic progress and future opportunities will be far greater.



What is Oracy?

Oracy is the ability to express yourself fluently and grammatically in speech.

Why are we focussing on oracy?

- We know that having students engaged in their learning will maximise their academic progress.
- Research shows that young
 people entering the work place
 lack the adequate communication
 and interpersonal skills needed.
- Improves confidence



What will this look like for your child?

- Our first focus, whole school, will be on developing students' ability to discuss with one another, through our phrase 'Turn & Talk'.
- Through a high-quality oracy education students learn through talk and to talk. This is when they develop and deepen their subject knowledge and understanding through talk in the classroom.

Turn & Talk Expectations

1) Turn to face your partner



2) Listen to what your partner is saying



3) Switch; everyone must talk



4) Feedback when asked to the whole class



How can you support your child at home?

- Encourage your child to make eye contact with the people they are talking to
- Encourage your child to talk in full sentences and model this to them
- Introduce your child to new vocabulary
- Encourage your child to read aloud to you
