EDULINK ONE - SCHOOL APP

You will have received a text message from the school recently with your login details to our management information app, Edulink (downloadable for your mobile device). This allows you to view various information regarding your child(ren), including attendance, behaviour academic records. Receiving communications electronically is far more efficient and friendly to the environment, with the vast reduction in paper waste. Please ensure that you utilise this new resource and keep updated with the progress of your child(ren) at Yardleys.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Please note that all pupils should enter the building by 8:40am through the playground doors and will be recorded as late beyond this time We expect all children to have excellent attendance to school. Parents and carers of any child not in school will be telephoned at the beginning of the day.

Attendance and punctuality update

At Yardleys School, we know that excellent attendance is one of the key factors in educational outcomes and exam results – those students who attend school ontime, everyday get the best GCSE outcomes. This is supported by the Department for Education who state: "[Excellent attendance] is essential for pupils to get the most out of their school experience, including their attainment, wellbeing, and wider life chances".



In line with local and national government expectations, from September 2024, Yardleys School will be utilising the national framework for penalty notices with regards to attendance.

This means that:

Leave of absence during term time, e.g., holidays during term time

Referrals to Birmingham City Council will be made for any student who misses 10 or more continuous sessions (equivalent to five days) of school due to a leave of absence during term time. Such a referral is likely to lead to a Penalty Notice of £160 per student, per parent.

Unsatisfactory attendance

Referrals to Birmingham City Council will be made to address concerning levels of attendance. On the first and second occasions this process is utilised, parents are likely to receive a £160 penalty notice, per parent, per student. Under new government legislation, a third penalty notice will not be issued and instead, Birmingham City Council can utilise one of the following processes at this stage:

- Taking parents to court for unauthorised absence: Education Act 1996 Section 444(1) court can fine each parent up to £1,000 per child, order payment of prosecution costs and/or impose a Community Order.
- Taking parents to court for persistent unauthorised absence: Education Act 1996 Section 444(1A) court can fine each parent up to £2,500 per child, order payment of the prosecution costs, impose a Community Order and/or sentence you to a period of imprisonment of up to 3 months.

PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

Please Park in the designated parking spaces outside of school and **not illegally around the school gates**. We have had several complaints from neighbours of cars blocking driveways and other vehicle access points. This also creates a real danger to pedestrians, including our children, when they are leaving school or crossing the road. Please be considerate of others within our community.

BEHAVIOUR IN THE COMMUNITY & LOCAL BUSINESS

Please can parents and carers remind students of the importance of behaving safely on the way to and from school, for example when crossing roads, if in parks and in looking after the community. Pupils should not loiter outside the school gates, or local businesses and they should be mindful of local residents and members of the public at all times.

UNIFORM

We continue to expect high standards of uniform from pupils and the vast majority of pupils meet our expected standards. However, we need to remind pupils that they need to wear black leather shoes (not boots, trainers or canvas shoes); loose fitted trousers or skirts to an appropriate length (no jeans, leggings or rolled up trousers); no jewellery other than plain stud earrings and no excessive makeup. Please see the school website for further information and ensure that students when they return in September meet the school uniform requirements.
