REF: Assessment Week (AW) Reminder

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s)

I am writing with a reminder about Assessment Week next week.

Below again is your child's exam timetable for the week. During the first week of this half-term (w/b 2nd June) they were given a revision booklet (which can also be found [here](#) on the VLE, together with other useful information and resources, such as the Home Learning letters and How To Guides) which they should be using to prepare and revise for these exams.

In my previous letter, I stressed the especial importance of preparing and revising for their Science exams, so as to provide a most accurate demonstration of what they know, understand and can do as we enter Year 10 and consider both course (Triple or Combined Science) and tier (Higher or Foundation) entry. I would like to reiterate that message again – the outcome of these exams will, in-part, inform the above decision-making.

In terms of arrangements for the week:
