- You will have a chance to spend time with your friends at Breaktime and Lunchtime.
- You will have homework to complete.
- You are expected to be in school by a certain time.
- There is always someone you can speak to if you have a problem (Head of Year, Form Tutor, Subject Teachers).
- Members of staff at the school want the best for you and want you to do the best that you possibly can.

The Three 'R's...



- Having all equipment (stationary, uniform, timetable, PE kit etc)
- Having completed your homework.
- Making sure you've had enough rest/ sleep so you can function the next day.
- Making sure you're nourished/ hydrated.
- Ensuring you wake up early enough so you can get to school on time.



- Being responsible for having your own equipment.
- Being responsible for arriving on time.
- Being responsible for getting the most out of your education.
- Being responsible for conducting yourself in a safe, polite and respectful way.



- Using politeness and courtesy to ensure positive social and professional relationships.
- Arriving to school and lessons punctually (on time) so you don't interrupt a lesson.
- Show appreciation with your good conduct and effort.
